Although a highly diverse body of thought, it can be thought of as unified by the belief that world politics ultimately is always and necessarily a field of conflict among actors pursuing power. In the discipline of international relations there are contending general theories or theoretical perspectives. Liberalism. Liberalism is a perspective on international politics which views the state as the unit of analysis, but also includes international law, international organizations and nongovernmental organizations as increasingly important factors in world politics. International relations, the study of the relations of states with each other and with international organizations and certain subnational entities (e.g., bureaucracies, political parties, and interest groups). It is related to a number of other academic disciplines, including political science. Modern university departments of political science (alternatively called government or politics at some institutions) are often divided into several fields, each of which contains various subfields. The first separate school of political science was established in 1872 in France as the *École Libre*
